**BACKGROUND AND PERTINENT FACTS:**

The Foundation plans to implement a P-Card system to improve efficiency in accounts payable for funds managed by the Foundation and used for college program support. HC fund managers will be issued a P-Card as their roles require frequent operational purchases. Cardholders are selected based on duties, requirements, and approval. Each card has spending limits, restricted categories, and documentation standards. All transactions are reviewed, approved, and reconciled within the Foundation's financial system. The operation of this system will be precisely matched to that of the college P-Card system.

Our database vendor, Blackbaud, offers this program to us and has partnered with Regions Bank to facilitate it. To implement the program, Regions Bank requires the Foundation to establish a \$75,000 Line of Credit with them to assure monthly payments are covered.

State statute requires approval from the District Board of Trustees for any indebtedness by a DSO affiliated with the institution.

**ECONOMIC IMPACT:**

The Foundation will pay the monthly statement from Regions Bank for the P-Card system using designated funds, so it is anticipated that the \$75,000 will never be used.

**OBJECTIVE:**

Board approval for the Foundation to establish a line of credit not to exceed \$75,000 to support efficient, compliant purchasing P-Card operations in alignment with Hillsborough College. (HC).

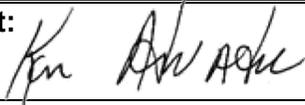

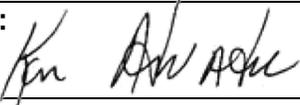
